


## Search for a New Music Coordinator



## Courtyard Garden Design

Senior Fieldworker for Holdfast Council Adam Kromkamp presented his design for our courtyard garden which was approved in principle. The design is focused on creating a welcoming space that will provide shade in summer and maximise the sun in winter. The design also covers some unsightly areas of the courtyard that are immovable. We seek to keep the garden simple and low maintenance while still offering interest in terms of colour and shape.

The Leadership Council welcomes your thoughts and feedback as we collect quotes from local landscapers for the work. A large print version of the plan is available at St. Andrew's for those who are interested.

We do not intend to keep the wicking beds that are great for growing veggies and flowers. One bed has been transplanted to the southwest edge of the hall for a kitchen herb garden. If you would like one or know someone who would, please let us know.
