Today we meet Attika (Muslim) and Mary (Christian), young mothers from Ambon who lost everything in violence that killed 5,000 and left 70,000 homeless. Against the odds, they've become like sisters, helping build strong relationships in a community healing from the trauma of violence.

Not long after filming Attika's story in her kitchen, we learnt that her entire home was tragically destroyed by last year's earthquakes in Ambon. She had built the home herself, saving \$5 a week from a small business UnitingWorld's partners helped her to establish. Attika is determined to rebuild, and with the help of our partners we're right there beside her.
